















PALACIO DE VELÁZQUEZ

YOU ARE HERE 9



Takes its name from the architect Ricardo Velázquez Bosco, who was responsible for its construction, along with the ceramicist Daniel Zuloaga and the engineer Alberto del Palacio.

The building, in the realm of Neo-renaissance historicism, has a spacious floor plan, vaulted ceilings with iron structures and natural lighting, thanks to a large area of glass. Conceived as the main pavilion for the International Exposition of Mining, Metal Arts, Ceramics, Glasswork and Mineral Waters of 1883, it follows the model used by Joseph Paxton for the Crystal Palace of London, built in 1851.

Since 1987 it has provided a venue for monographic exhibitions by artists such as Luciano Fabro, Beatriz González, Mario Merz or Tetsuya Ishida, among others

A few meters from where we are, is located the Palacio de Cristal.

PALACIO DE CRISTAL

Designed by the Spanish architect Ricardo Velázquez Bosco in 1887, the Palace's, bears witness both to an innovate use of materials such as iron and glass, and to the history of 19th century colonialism. The cast iron columns of the building, combined with large areas of glass and an unobstructed floor plan, create a monumental effect and were, at the time, very innovative, and intended to produce in viewers an impression of phantasy and unreal spaces.

The building was conceived as a greenhouse for the Plants of the Philippines Exhibition (1887), organized at a time when the Philippine Islands were still a Spanish colony. After the exhibition, during a time hosted the National Fine Arts Exhibitions.

Since 1990, houses site-specific projects and installations by contemporary artists. like those made by Doris Salcedo, Dominique Gonzalez-Foerster, Charles Ray or Hassan Khan, among others.

MAIN VENUE

Fifteen minute walk from here, in front of Atocha Station, is located the Main Venue of Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía, a point of reference in the international modern and contemporary art scene.

It houses one of the world's most famous and iconic modern art masterpieces, Guernica by Pablo Picasso, among other relevant works from the late nineteenth century to the present day, highlighting artists as Salvador Dalí, Joan Miró, María Blanchard, Ángeles Santos, Jörg Immendorff or Sara Ramo.

The Main Venue comprises two connected buildings that merge history and contemporaneity: the Sabatini Building, located on the site of the former Hospital de San Carlos, designed by José de Hermosilla and Francisco Sabatini in the eighteenth century, and declared one of Spain's Historic-Artistic Monuments of National Interest in 1977; and the Nouvel Building, a contemporary expansion designed by renowned architect Jean Nouvel and opened in 2005.

Visitors can discover the collection, housed within these two buildings and on their different floors, and also enjoy the temporary exhibitions and the huge cultural activities program.
